Introduction by the Celebrant

ENTRANCE ANT. [God's Love and Justice]

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

Penitential Act

Let us examine ourselves before the Lord whether we always welcome and accept him and in his name reject all evil:

Have mercy on us, Lord, and forgive us that by sinning we have turned against you. Bring us back, forgive us, and lead us to everlasting life. **Amen.**

First Reading Ez 2:2-5 [God's Prophet]

Ezekiel is selected by God to be a prophet and messenger to the Israelites. When resisted, Ezekiel

is to say: "Thus says the Lord God!" In this way they shall see that he is a prophet.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel

As the Lord spoke to me, the spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me: Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have revolted against me to this very day. Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the Lord God! And whether they heed or resist-for they are a rebellious house-they shall know that a prophet has been among them.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 123 [Eyes on God]

Second Reading 2 Cor 12:7-10

[Suffering for Christ]

Paul is given a "thorn in the flesh." He asks God for relief and God replies that his grace is sufficient.

A reading from the second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters: That I, Paul, might not become too elated, because of the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of

Christ may dwell with me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecution, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong.

Gospel Mk 6:1-6 [*Spreading the Good News*]

Jesus began to teach in his home synagogue. The people, knowing Mary and Joseph, cannot understand the wisdom Jesus shows and Jesus tells them: "No prophet is without honor except in his native place."

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples. When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joseph and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

The Lord's Supper
