[Obeying the Law]

We heed the word of the Lord by living his commandments. His word is not foreign to us.

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy

The Lord's Supper

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:
