Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Oft

with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah!  
There earn your bread by prophesying, but  
never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the  
king's sanctuary and a royal temple," Amos  
answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have  
I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a  
shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The Lord  
took me from following the flock, and said to

Ephesians

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord  
Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with  
every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he  
chose us in him, before the foundation of the  
world, to be holy and without blemish before  
him. In love he destined us for adoption to  
himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with

**Gospel** Mk 6:7-13 **[Spreading the Gospel]**

*Jesus sent out the Twelve, instructing them to take only a walking stick and to preach the gospel. If they were refused a listening ear, they should leave the locality. They worked many miracles.*

Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.” So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

**Preface III Of The Sunday Ordinary Time**

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For we know it belongs to your boundless glory, that you came to the aid of mortal beings with your divinity and even fashioned for us a remedy out of mortality itself, that the cause of our downfall might become the means of our salvation, through Christ our Lord.

Through him the host of Angels adores your majesty and rejoices in your presence for ever. May our voices, we pray, join with theirs in one chorus of exultant praise, as we acclaim:

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts....**

**Eucharistic Prayer No.2**

**Praise to the Father**

You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness.

**Invocation of the Holy Spirit**

**The Lord's Supper**

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

**Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.**

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice and, once more giving thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying:

**Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.**

**Do this in memory of me.**

**Memorial Acclamation**

Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, we offer you Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation, giving thanks that you have healed us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you.
