First Reading 2 Kgs 5:14-17 *[Gratitude to God]*

The healing power of God comes to a man who does not belong to the chosen people, and he proclaims his faith in the Lord.

A reading from the second Book of Kings

Naaman went down and plunged into the Jordan seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God. His flesh became again like the

flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy. Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival he stood before Elisha and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant."

Elisha replied, "As the Lord lives whom I serve, I will not take it"; and despite Naaman's urging, he still refused. Naaman said: "If you will not accept, please let me, your servant, have two mule-loads of earth, for I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the Lord."

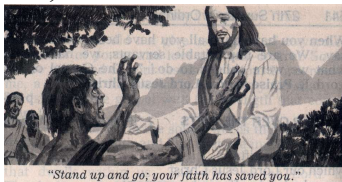
