*Job describes our life on earth. The days of
our life come to a swift end. However, we are
heartened by the fuller revelation of an
eternal life hereafter, which Christ brought to
us and about which Job did not have a clear
idea.*

A reading from the Book of Job

Job spoke, saying: Is not man's life on earth a

drudgery? Are not his days those of a hireling?
He is a slave who longs for the shade, a hireling
who waits for his wages. So I have been
assigned months of misery, and troubled nights
have been allotted to me. If in bed I say, "When
shall I arise?" then the night drags on; I am
filled with restlessness until the dawn. My days
are swifter than a weaver's shuttle; they come
to an end without hope. Remember that my life
is like the wind; I shall not see happiness again.

A reading from the first Letter of Saint Paul to
the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters: If I preach the gospel,
this is no reason for me to boast, for an obliga-
tion has been imposed on me, and woe to me if
I do not preach it! If I do so willingly, I have a
recompense, but if unwillingly, then I have
been entrusted with a stewardship. What then
is my recompense? That, when I preach, I offer
the gospel free of charge so as not to make full
use of my right in the gospel.

Although I am free in regard to all, I have made
myself a slave to all so as to win over as many
as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win
over the weak. I have become all things to all,

to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it.

Jesus visits the home of Simon and Andrew. He cures Simon's mother-in-law. Jesus also expels many demons and then goes off to pray alone. When found by Simon, Jesus goes in the villages to preach the good news.

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them. When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him. Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

Eucharistic Prayer No. 2

KNEEL

Praise to the Father

You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness.

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Lord's Supper

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice and, once more giving thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in memory of me.

Memorial Acclamation
