First Reading

Acts 1:15-17, 20a-26 [Choice of Matthias]
*Peter discusses the question of Judas and his
replacement. Two were nominated and all prayed. Then
they drew lots and the choice fell to Matthias.*

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles
Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers-there was a
group of about one hundred and twenty persons in

the one place-. He said, "My brothers, the Scripture
had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke
beforehand through the mouth of David, concerning
Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested
Jesus. He was numbered among us and was allotted a
share in this ministry.

"For it is written in the Book of Psalms:

May another take his office.

"Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men
who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus
came and went among us, beginning from the
baptism of John until the day on which he was taken
up from us, become with us a witness to his
resurrection." So they proposed two, Judas called
Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and
Matthias. Then they prayed, "You, Lord, who know
the hearts of all, show which one of these two you
have chosen to take the place in this apostolic
ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his
own place." Then they gave lots to them, and the lot
fell upon Matthias, and he was counted with the
eleven apostles.

God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him.

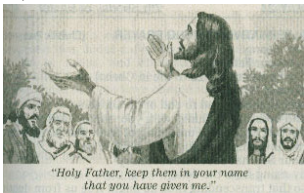

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord.

For after his Resurrection he plainly appeared to all his disciples and was taken up to heaven in their sight, that he might make us sharers in his divinity.

Therefore, overcome with paschal joy, every land, every people exults in your praise and even the heavenly Powers, with the angelic hosts, sing together the unending hymn of your glory, as they acclaim:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts....

Eucharistic Prayer No.3

KNEEL

Praise to the Father

You are indeed Holy, O Lord, and all you have created rightly gives you praise, for through your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, by the power and working of the Holy Spirit, you give life to all things and make them holy, and you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration that they may become the Body and * Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate these mysteries.

The Lord's Supper

For on the night he was betrayed he himself took bread, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in memory of me.

Memorial Acclamation

The Memorial Prayer
