RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

"I ask everyone with political responsibility to remember two things: human dignity and the common good." (Pope Francis)

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Rights and responsibilities are two themes central to any discussion of social justice. The notion of rights denotes some legal, social, or ethical principles of freedom or entitlement ascribed to a relevant subject such as human beings, hence human rights. These principles characteristically inform the fundamental normative rules about what is allowed of people or owed to people and are therefore often considered pillars of society and culture. The basis for assigning and upholding these rights is human dignity, which is predicated on the belief that all people hold a special value that is tied solely to their humanity. Catholic Social Justice even makes more explicit the spiritual view that all people are made in the image of God and so possess an equal and inalienable worth. The pursuit of social justice is only possible when people are treated equally regardless of their class, race, gender, religion, abilities, or factor other than them being human. Human rights are thus promoted precisely to safeguard people's proper lives as human beings. Contd.....

Human dignity is not defined only by the rights that people are able to exercise, however, but also by responsibilities they need to show. The call for responsibilities is made on the same basis that each person


needs to be allowed to live to his or her full potential as intended by God. To attain this purpose, all people whose rights are being upheld need to work together and share responsibility for the good of the community. The notion of the common good conveys the idea that all members of the community



need to make available to each other various resources and facilities – whether material, cultural or institutional – in order for their common interests to be served. Only then can each person's dignity may be safeguarded and promoted.

We see here the notion of rights goes hand in hand with that of responsibilities in the same way as the idea of human dignity is intimately linked to that of the common good. Sometimes we emphasize our rights too strongly at the expense of our social responsibilities. We must not forget the spiritual view that grounds the concept of human dignity, namely, our equal uniqueness and worth before God. Such view may help us better connect the common good we pursue with the spiritual life we live out. It brings us down to the bare fact that we are all merely mortal beings who truly need each other here on earth in order for each one of us to live fully as God has intended.


