## ***BUILDING AN INTEGRAL ECOLOGY: OUR REDEEMING CALL***

***Beloved Sisters and Brothers,***

Looking around at our neighborhoods, cities, and larger areas of our lives with clear eyes we can see easily a sense of disconnectedness among substantial aspects of life. Concerns for having a good repair, better solutions and friendly co-existence with other realities of life is somewhat unquestionable and urgent. Natural disasters, deforestation and disruption of biodiversity caused by human errors have become so common and happening all over the world. Some are very massive and painful to watch but a redemption is also real and a must without so much delay. We all together race against time to save our planet and ecology.



A holistic framework to build integral ecology is an essential call to all residents of this earth which our common home. For us our earth is our home sweet home that need to be taken care of. This holistic framework touches important aspects of life such as environment, social and economic life as well as cultural realities that could be in danger. They all are deeply interconnected. The negative consequences are real and visible when we see unbalanced realities between the rich and the

poor, between the exploited both land and nature and the exploiters-there are many much issues relating to greed, ethical focuses and moral responsibilities. This is what Pope Francis in his 'Laudato Si' is calling all of us, citizens of this earth to once again re-build our planet earth from destruction and take care this earth for our future generations. This encyclical has received much positive acknowledgment from different and international organizations due to real problems concerning our planet earth. It is our common ethical and moral responsibilities dealing with our earth. The call for a drastic change and shift is here and now.



Ecological conversion to create an integral ecology has become a crucial means and call. However, this is something new for many people at first since we are so accustomed to what we call a religious conversion. This religious conversion is so common in the life of believers across religions that can lead to a change of life in the ways they live it. Religious conversion is the voluntary or pressured adoption of a new set of religious beliefs and practices, often involving a shift from one faith or denomination to another. It is a

complex, often gradual process—or sometimes a sudden, intense experience—driven by personal, social, cultural, or spiritual motivations, including, in some instances, visions. Many conversions are influenced by personal crises, relationships, and the search for meaning. Research shows that 50–70% of certain studied groups, such as converts from Islam to Christianity, reported experiencing dreams or visions. While often spiritual, conversion can also occur under social, cultural, or political pressure, or be motivated by socioeconomic factors, according to studies and reports. For me, religious conversion can be a two-edged sword on one hand it leads to a more serene and tranquil religious experiences and one the other hand it can lead to a more radical and fanatical attitudes of faith. In recent years, the second has become so alarming across different religious practices among believers of major religions. Meanwhile we are also challenged by another conversion that is well known as a moral conversion. Moral conversion is a profound, often sudden, transformation of an individual's moral compass, leading to a shift from self-interested or poor behaviour to a committed life of virtue and new ethical standards. It involves a change of heart, a reordering of values, and a conscious



decision to pursue the truly good, often requiring a difficult restructuring of personal commitments. It is a conversion that has a final goal of experiencing better ways of moral attitudes within morality and life perspectives. It is certainly a never-ending process of conversion since we continue to face different realities of moral judgments.

Thus, creating an integral ecology needs a holistic approach that goes beyond ecological conversion and should touch different transformations that are integral and life-giving experiences. Small steps of self-transformation geared up towards positive attitudes would certainly enhance greater actions to care for our planet earth. These small steps could be a redeeming call for us.

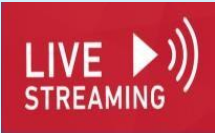

During the YF session, Reaction Matters I was able to learn a lot about bullying, what it is and how to handle situations involving it. For one, I learnt that Deacon Klaus himself used to be a bully and we walked through his experience all the while learning that people don't always intend to bully, but it doesn't make their experience right.

Furthermore, we learnt that bullying is a repeated action. It needs to happen more than once, so bullying is never accidental.

For the saint of the day, we discussed Saint Joseph of Cupertino. St Joseph too, used to be bullied for simply being different.

After the saint of the day, we shared about what actions are deemed bullying and which actions aren't. Then, we celebrated the March birthdays.

My key take away from this session is that bullying is a domino effect. If we don't make an effort to end it, it will continue to prevail.



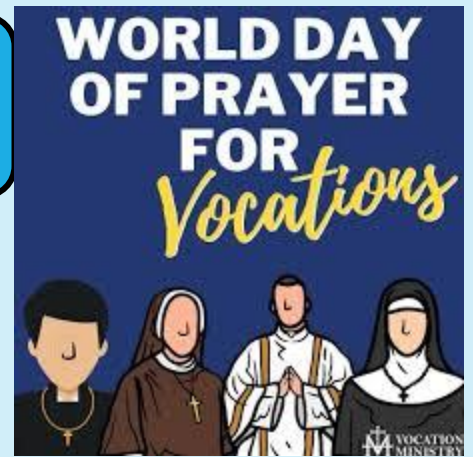

## VOCATION SUNDAY

### *The Call to Discipleship*



***“A vocation is a precious gift that God sows in our heart, a call to leave ourselves behind and embark on a journey of love and service. Every vocation in the Church, whether lay, ordained or consecrated, is a sign of the hope that God has for this world and for each of his children.” Pope Francis***

Vocation Sunday stands as a profound reminder of the divine calling that every Christian receives, a divine invitation to serve, to love, and to bear witness to the Gospel in unique and meaningful ways. Everyone has a different calling, some are called to married life, others to priesthood or religious life, but all are called to holiness and service. This day reminds us that vocations are born not only in seminaries and convents, but they first take place in families, parishes, and in the deep down of our hearts, when we pay heed to the voice of the Good Shepherd, our Lord Jesus.



On April 25th and 26th, our parish community of St. Peter Canisius Expat Parish in Jakarta joyfully celebrated this special occasion. The Jesuit brothers hosted a vibrant vocation booth in the church, where they engaged with the parishioners (children, teenagers, and adults) in a meaningful dialogue about the Society of Jesus and the broader spectrum of religious life. It was truly encouraging to witness the curiosity and enthusiasm of both children and youth as they inquired about the nature of our vocation, reflecting a seed of discernment taking root. Their questions were simple yet profound: What does a Jesuit do? How does one become a Jesuit? Is religious life difficult? It was moving to see such genuine interest, especially among the young, whose openness and enthusiasm reminded us that God continues to plant seeds of vocation in new generations.

One of the most delightful and creative moments of the celebration was the special procession during the Holy Mass, where children dressed as priests, nuns, bishop, and religious brothers. The visual impact of this colourful procession created a moment of wonder and reflection, bringing smiles to the congregation, but more importantly stirring something deeper, the diversity and richness of vocations. Even if just symbolically but the children were able to “step into” these vocations, because vocations can begin with imagination, and with a sense of belonging within the church.

During the homily, the three Jesuit brothers, Bro. Wishal, SJ and Bro. Edo, SJ along with Deacon Klaus, SJ shared their personal vocation stories of how they recognized the voice of the Good Shepherd in their lives. They also shared about their struggles, moments of discernment, the joys and the divine grace that sustain them in their religious life. Such testimonies were aimed to foster a deeper understanding among the

congregation that vocations grow through ordinary people who dare to trust God's extraordinary call in their ordinary lives.

Fr. Agung, SJ also offered a poignant reminder to the parishioners that it is essential that we pray for vocations in general, asking God to send more priests and religious. But perhaps we should also dare to pray more personally—that our own children, from our own families, may be open to such a call.

In essence, Vocation Sunday at our parish was not merely an event, but a grace-filled encounter, reminding each one that vocation is a gift from God and we as his children should respond with courage and enthusiasm.

Let us renew our commitment to pray for divine guidance for all the religious priests, nuns and clergy that they may continue to serve Christ and his church with love and passion. Dear Lord nurture the hearts and faith of our youth that they may remain attentive to your calling in their lives.

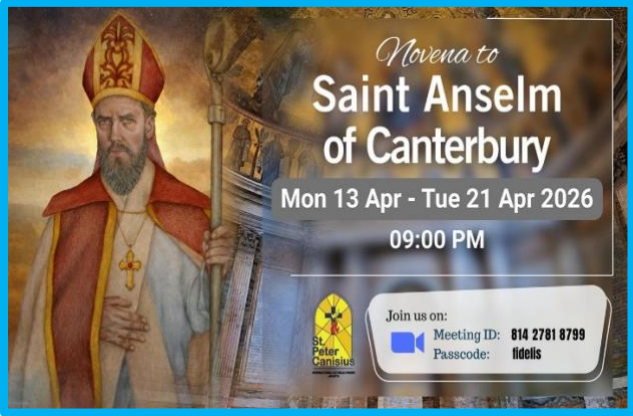

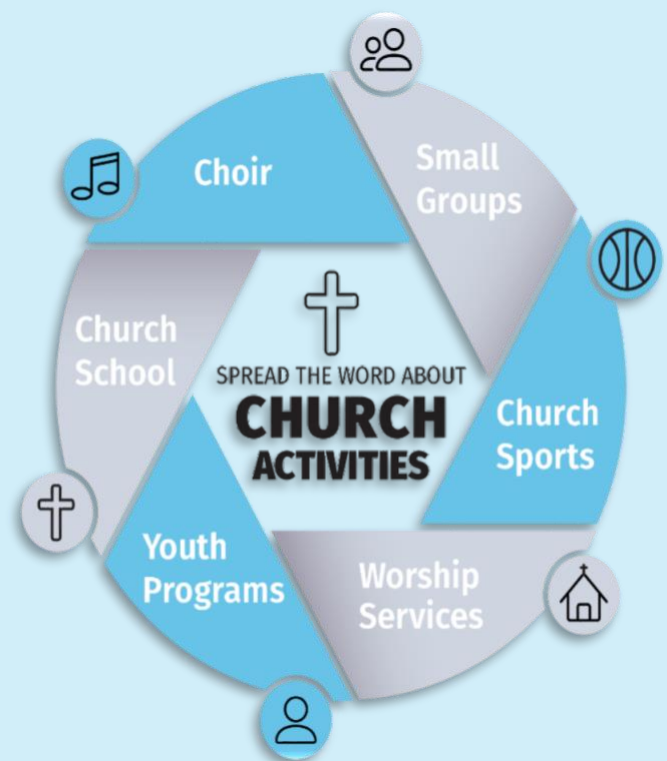


