

Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM)

Talk Session on "The Holy Spirit Family Guidance".

On Pentecost, we celebrate the birth of the Church for Jesus completed HIS mission, gave the Holy Spirit to the disciples and the disciples began to preach the good news.

Jesus promised that disciples will receive power, a very important aspect in life. HE said this in *Acts 1: 8 "but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you and you will be MY witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the Earth"*. After the crucifixion of Jesus, the disciples locked themselves in a room, were imprisoned by fear. Once the disciples received the Holy Spirit, the transformation began. They became fully courageous, bravely preached the gospel with such enthusiasm with such power. They preached in various languages,



were able to communicate with people who were listening to them and were able to get the message across.

Today, a family is a small church, a domestic church, Ecclesia Domestica, especially during the time of pandemic. We need to really live this call of being a domestic church as families. We always have to ask for the Holy Spirit to be present. The Holy Spirit is given to the disciples in order for them to be able to preach



the good news, be able to communicate. In fact, communication is also a very crucial element in family. To communicate, we have to be able to speak and to listen more. Sin divides us and disables us to listen and because we are not able to listen then we cannot communicate well, sinful nature. The lesson from the

Tower of Babel where people initially collaborated with a foundation of sin to make name only for themselves and to throw away God then along the way, they were divided and destroyed.

When the Holy Spirit is present in our lives, HE does sanctify and building the church in our lives by giving us the sanctifying grace. The sanctifying grace could be the gifts of the Holy Spirit or the Holy Spirit itself present in us, in our hearts. Wisdom is one of the gifts. A sinful person can never be a wise person. We cannot be wise and at the same time sinful. We cannot be sinful and expect to be wised. To be wised, we need to have clean, clear, and good heart, and that is only possible when the Holy Spirit is in our heart.



In theology, there is a principal called connaturally. It is a way to know that we are to be one with God, by keeping on praying, listening to God, and really building relationship with God. The way of connaturally is knowing by way of the heart. Like husband and wife who have long aged together such that they know each other by heart and resemble each other.



When the Holy Spirit is present in our hearts, HE is changing us to become gradually like God himself that we don't need so much words from God. Our heart is beating like God's heart that's the way of life of the Saint. As we are not Saint, we have to keep on praying, keep on developing relationship with God, keep on listening to his words, reading his words, the Bible. Of course God is communicating with us with our own way also as a human being. Read the Bible and/or try to have time to meditate on the Bible so we will understand better and better each day what is really God's will and live with God.

In Bible, Charisma is about prophetic word. God speaks through prophets by whispering HIS message to be conveyed to people. The prophetic knowledge and prophetic ability are not given to people as something that will be always available when needed. God can give people knowledge from time to time which will not depend on people but it depends on God. In the bible, even prophets sometimes don't know what will happen. They can't assume that they always receive answer from God.

NOVENA to ST. JOHN MARIE VIANNEY

On August 4, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. John Vianney, patron saint of priests. John Vianney, also known as the Holy Curé de Ars. He was ordained a priest in 1815 and became curate in Ecully. He was then sent to the remote French community of Ars in 1818 to be a parish priest. He was known for his immense dedication to the sacrament of reconciliation, and he even had to face multiple times evil attacks. He was committed to the conversion of the people and would spend up to 16 hours a day in the confessional.

The Holy Curé of Ars was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925. He is the patron saint of priests. Over 450,000 pilgrims travel to Ars every year in remembrance of his holy life.

As we ask St. John Marie Vianney to intercede for our parish priests as well as all other priests, so that they may continue to inspire and evangelize one soul at a time through "perennial tools of the Church: prayer, fasting, the sacraments and preaching".

During this period, we held special 09 days online novena praying for St. John Vianney.

OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Our Lady of the Seven Sorrows by which the Virgin Mary is referred to in relation to sorrows in her life. Virgin Mary is portrayed, sorrowful and in tears, with one or seven long knives or daggers piercing her heart, often bleeding. Meditation on the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady is a way of sharing in the sorrows of Mary's life.

Seven Sorrows of Mother Mary: 1. The Prophecy of Simeon, 2. The Flight into Egypt, 3. Loss of the Child Jesus in the Tempe of Jerusalem, 4. Mary's meeting with Jesus on the way to Calvary, 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus on the Mount Calvary, 6. Jesus is taken down from the Cross, & 7. Burial of Jesus

To commemorate the seven sorrows of our Mother Mary, STPCICP's Young Adults have initiated devotion to our Lady of Sorrow starting from 01st Saturday of July 2021 until 01st Saturday on Jan 2022. On Every first Saturday 's of the month we will pray together and also will reflect on each sorrows of Mother Mary.


