To Love More

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

As Christians we are very familiar with the commandment of our Lord Jesus Christ: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbour as yourself" (Mark 12:3031). Jesus calls LOVE the greatest commandment and connects the love of God and the love of neighbour. We cannot really say we love God if we do not love our neighbour. When we open our eyes to our neighbour's needs, we open our hearts to God. Jesus is counting on our love to live our relationship with him and with others.



The command to love calls us to a new way of living, meaning that our whole life should be permeated and guided by loving the Lord and loving our neighbour. The more we love, the more we are going to see the world with the eyes of Christ, and the more we are going to think about other people with the mind of Christ. This means that by loving others we go beyond our personal to social life. Love involves the responsibility that we have for others in society. We may say that Christian love is always missionary, meaning that our love reaches out others, especially those who are vulnerable: the unborn, the widows and orphans, the migrants and refugees, the poor and the marginalized.

It has now been a year since the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic, which has claimed millions of lives and changed the ways of relating, interacting, working, studying, doing activities, and of navigating the world. We must live with so many restrictions and bans to curb the spread of Covid-19 virus.

There are positive and negative effects or impacts, ups and downs, we all must face. On one side this

situation can bring the family members closer to each other and help them strengthen their bond. Others feel a renewed sense of community, as loved ones stay in closer contact and greater interaction. On the other, people must face health difficulties, depression, anxiety, social isolation, and much grief. Its spread has left national economies and businesses counting the costs, as governments struggle with new lockdown measures to tackle the spread of the virus.



With the advent of COVID-19 vaccines there is a renewed hope that the world will open in due course. But the vaccination that is going on still cannot guarantee the pandemic will soon end. It seems that more threats to health crises are to occur in the future. Thus, a better health system is needed to respond quickly to any similar pandemic disease.

This pandemic has taught us that we and the world must learn great lasting lessons. One good lesson is how to express our love in a concrete way by sharing, being compassionate and in solidarity with others. We are asked to love more. It is not enough we say, "I have helped someone with this and that, nothing else to give." Love is not meant for one moment only. And such love is neither easy. Our genuine love calls us to move beyond our own comfort, our own prejudices. It takes hard work. We are called to care for others' safety and health, not just ours. This love thus challenges us to grow into a new way of living, a new lifestyle. This makes our life a way of love. This is the beauty of love: being first loved by God we move to love others in a special and concrete way.

I know that God is with us every time. He is in our side. He is the God I want to ask for help with in all the things I am dealing with.







THE CALL TO HOLINESS

We are all called to holiness by living our lives with love and bearing witness, and in the everyday turning to God. As well as through big challenges, holiness grows through small gestures: refusing to gossip, listening with patience and love, saying a kind word to a poor person.



Holiness keeps us faithful to our deepest self, free from every form of enslavement, and bearing fruit for our world. Holiness does not make us less human since it is an encounter between our weakness and the power of God's grace. But we need moments of solitude and silence before God, to face our true selves and let the Lord enter.


Gnosticism and Pelagianism, two "false forms of holiness" lead us astray. Gnostics fail to realize that our perfection is measured by the depth of our charity, not by information or knowledge. Christian experience is not a set of intellectual exercises. The same power that Gnosticism attributed to the

intellect, Pelagianism attributed to the human will, to personal effort. Pelagians suggest that human will is something pure, perfect, all-powerful, to which grace is then added. They fail to realize that in this life human weaknesses are not healed completely and once for all by grace.

The Beatitudes are Jesus's portrayal of what it means to be holy in our daily lives. We can only practice them if the Holy Spirit fills us with his power and frees us from our weakness, selfishness, complacency, and pride.

Pope Francis describes the Beatitudes and their invitation as:

- "Being poor of heart is holiness."
- "Reacting with meekness and humility is holiness."
- "Knowing how to mourn with others is holiness."
- "Hungering and thirsting for righteousness is holiness."
- "Seeing and acting with mercy is holiness."
- "Keeping a heart free of all that tarnishes love is holiness."
- "Sowing peace all around us is holiness."
- "Accepting daily the path of the Gospel, even though it may cause us problems is holiness."




SIGNS OF HOLINESS IN TODAY'S WORLD

1) Perseverance, patience, and meekness.

This describes the inner strength, grounded in God that makes it possible to give a witness of constancy in doing good. We need to recognize and combat our aggressive and selfish inclinations. It is not good when we look down on others like heartless judges. That is itself a subtle form of violence. Being on the path to holiness means enduring "daily humiliations".

2) Joy and a sense of humour

The saints are joyful and full of good humour. They radiate a positive and hopeful spirit, even in hard times. Sadness can be a sign of ingratitude for God's gifts.



3) Boldness and passion

Holiness is also a boldness, an impulse to evangelize and to leave a mark in this world. The saints surprise us because by their lives they urge us to abandon a dull and dreary mediocrity. In this way, the Church will not stand still, but constantly welcome the Lord's surprises.

4) In community

Growth in holiness is a journey of living and working in community with others. Sharing the word and celebrating the Eucharist together fosters fraternity and makes us a holy and missionary community.

5) In constant prayer

Trust-filled prayer of any length is a response of a heart open to encountering God face to face, where the quiet voice of the Lord can be heard. In that silence, we can discern the paths of holiness to which the Lord is calling us. Prayer of supplication is an expression of a heart that trusts in God and realizes that it can do nothing of itself. Prayer of petition often calms our hearts and helps us persevere in hope. Prayer of intercession is an act of trust in God and, at the same time, an expression of love for our neighbour.

Our path towards holiness is a constant battle for which the Lord equips us with prayer, the word of God,



the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic adoration, sacramental Reconciliation, works of charity, etc. The path of holiness is a source of peace and joy, given to us by the Spirit. Discernment is a grace. It is not only for the more intelligent or better educated. It requires no special abilities, but it does require listening: to the Lord and to others,

and to reality itself, which always challenges us in new ways. Listening frees us to set aside our own partial or insufficient ideas, our usual ways of seeing things.

God asks everything of us, yet he also gives everything to us. He does not want to enter our lives to diminish them but to bring them to fulfilment. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to pour out upon us a fervent longing to be saints for God's greater glory and let us encourage one another in this effort. In this way, we will share a happiness that the world will not be able to take from us.

Sacrament of Reconciliation / FHC & Confirmation



The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) (1212) states that the sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. "The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace

of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. The faithful are born



anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing

measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity.

This pandemic season has turned everything online, including Mass. Under these circumstances, we have



been working within the constraints, both regulatory and practical, to ensure that our "First Holy Communion" and "Sacrament of Confirmation" are initiated physically to our children. Last year, initiation of all these sacraments was kept on hold. We are heartened by our children's love for Jesus and delighted that we were able to celebrate their sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation this year. After a year of living with Covid-related restrictions, we have learned a lot about how to worship and to celebrate special days while following safety precautions.

We have divided our students from our 2019-20 and 2020-21 CCD Programmes into smaller batches for First

Holy Communion and Confirmation Masses to keep the number of Church attendees at a safe level. The planning and operation of this was a major effort and we would like to express our gratitude to our Parish Office staff, our Covid Task Force volunteers, our STPCICP volunteers, including ushers and readers, and our CCD Coordinators



and volunteers. Also, to all parents and CCD families for their patience and cooperation throughout.



Despite these variations, the FHC and Confirmations have been and will continue to be as meaningful as ever. "The Mass will be special for kids and parents because they are receiving the Sacrament," and Covid does not negate the graces poured out from the

Sacrament." During the months of May to July 2021 we have prepared specific days for small-batch Masses, covering over 150 FHC students and over 100 Confirmation students.

To quote one of our CCD Coordinators, who thanked Fr Moko and all STPCICP volunteers: Parents come to me and express their appreciation for the beautiful Mass and all the love and efforts poured into our children's continuing faith journey.

Novena to the Holy Spirit




