First Reading Ez 34:11-12, 15-17

[The Lord's Care]

The Lord looks after his own flock. He takes them to pasture
and rescues them. He goes after those who are lost. He will
also judge them.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel

Thus says the Lord God: I myself will look after and
tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he

finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I
tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place
where they were scattered when it was cloudy and
dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will
give them rest, says the Lord God. The Lost I will
seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I
will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and
the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

Second Reading 1 Cor 15:20-26,28

[Christ the Firstfruits]

Christ has risen, and he is the firstfruits of the dead. All
have life in him. He will reign and all will be subjected
to him.

A reading from the first Letter of Saint Paul to the
Corinthians

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from
the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen
asleep. For since death came through man, the
resurrection of the dead came also through man. For
just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be
brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ
the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong
to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over
the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has
destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and
power. For he must reign until he has put all his
enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be
destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to
him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to
the one who subjected everything to him, so that
God may be all in all.

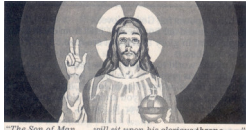
Alleluia Mk 11:9, 10 [Son of David]

Gospel Mt 25:31-46 [The Last Judgement]

All people will come to be judged by the Son of Man seated on his royal throne. The sheep will be on his right, the goats on his left. He will reward all good and punish all evil.

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?' When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, what ever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God

Eucharistic Prayer No.3

KNEEL

Praise to the Father

You are indeed Holy, O Lord, and all you have created rightly gives you praise, for through your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, by the power and working of the Holy

Spirit, you give life to all things and make them holy, and you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration that they may become the Body and Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate these mysteries.

The Lord's Supper

For on the night he was betrayed he himself took bread, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me.

Memorial Acclamation

Priest : The mystery of faith.

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

The Memorial Prayer

Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice.

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church and, recognizing the sacrificial Victim by whose death you willed to reconcile us to yourself, grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ.

In Communion with the Saints

May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs, with Saint N: *patron saint* and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unailing help.
