Integrity of Creation and the Social Teaching of the Catholic Church

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

The Archdiocese of Jakarta has launched the theme for the strategic direction of 2026 as "**Integrity of Creation**".

The concept of the integrity of creation refers to the wholeness, goodness, and harmonious order of the natural world as willed by God. In the Catholic tradition, this principle is deeply interwoven with the Church's social teaching, which calls for respect, care, and responsible stewardship of the environment.

The relationship between ecology and Catholic teaching is deeply rooted in the belief that the Earth is God's creation and that humanity has a responsibility to care for it. Catholic social teaching, especially as articulated in documents like Pope Francis's encyclical *Laudato Si'*, emphasizes a moral and spiritual duty to protect the environment.

We will focus our topics in our parish bulleting this year on this important issues:

- 1. Integrity of Creation (February)**
- 2. Creation as a Gift (March)**

Catholic doctrine teaches that the Earth and all its resources are gifts from God, entrusted to humanity for care and preservation. This view encourages gratitude and stewardship rather than exploitation.

- 3. Human Stewardship (April)**

Humans are seen as stewards, not owners, of creation. This stewardship calls for responsible management and protection of the environment for current and future generations.

4. Integral Ecology (May)

The Church advocates for an “integral ecology,” recognizing the interconnectedness of social, environmental, economic, and spiritual dimensions of life. Harm to one aspect inevitably affects the others.



5. Option for the Poor and Vulnerable (June)

The degradation of the environment disproportionately impacts the poor and vulnerable. Catholic teaching calls for special concern for the marginalized, ensuring environmental justice and equity.

6. Respect for Life (July)

Respecting all forms of life, from the unborn to endangered species, is central to Catholic teaching. The Church urges protection of biodiversity and the sanctity of all living things.

7. Care for Future Generations (August)

Catholic social teaching emphasizes the moral duty to preserve the Earth for future generations, ensuring that the resources and beauty of creation are not wasted or destroyed.

8. Solidarity and the Common Good (September)

Environmental issues require collaborative action. The Church promotes global solidarity and cooperation in addressing ecological crises, emphasizing the common good over individual interests.

9. Simplicity and Moderation (October)

Living simply and moderating consumption are encouraged to reduce environmental impact. Catholic teaching warns against materialism and calls for lifestyles that respect the limits of nature.


10. Conversion of Heart (November)

Ecological conversion is a spiritual transformation, inviting individuals and communities to renew their relationship with creation through prayer, reflection, and sustainable actions.

11. Role of the Church in Advocacy (December)

The Catholic Church actively engages in environmental advocacy, educating and mobilizing the faithful to participate in ecological protection and policy-making for the care of our common home.

These themes reflect the profound ways in which Catholic teaching aligns with ecological principles, calling all people to honour, care for, and preserve Mother Nature as a sacred trust.





The prayer was conducted in a simple and contemplative manner, inspired by Taizé prayer, with repetitive chants and moments of silence. Sitting together on the carpet, we were invited into a prayerful atmosphere that encouraged stillness, listening, and unity of heart. We were also grateful to reconnect with friends from the Theresia Taizé team, reminding us that unity is nurtured through shared prayer and friendship. Church leaders from various Christian denominations were present, bearing witness to the richness of diversity within the one Body of Christ. This year's theme, **"One Body, One Spirit, One Hope"** (Ephesians 4:4), invited us to reflect on God's Fatherhood, Creation, the Incarnation of Jesus, the work of the Holy Spirit, and the mission of the Church. As we prayed together, we were reminded that unity is not something we create by ourselves, but a gift from God — lived out through humility, forgiveness, and love. May this shared prayer strengthen our commitment to live as one Church and to build God's Kingdom of peace in our daily lives.



Ark Bible Club (ABC): Nurturing the Young Hearts in Faith



The Ark Bible Club (ABC) is a joyful new initiative of our parish, launched in September 2025, specially designed for our youngest children aged 4 to 8 years, who have not yet received their First Holy Communion. This weekly Sunday program helps children take their first steps in faith by introducing them to Jesus through simple Bible stories, songs, prayers, and engaging activities, all in a loving and child-friendly environment.



Classes are held every Sunday from 2:00 PM to 2:45 PM, guided by our dedicated volunteer teachers. After the session, children will join their parents to participate in the Holy Mass, helping them develop an early understanding of the importance of worship and family faith life.

During the initial months, the sessions were conducted during Mass time, with children joining the blessing in church. To further instil the value and reverence of the Holy Mass from a young age, the class timing has now been adjusted to 2:00 PM, allowing children to attend the Ark Bible Club first and then participate fully in the Mass with their families.

To strengthen connection and communication within our growing community, we are pleased to introduce our Territorial Contact Persons — dedicated volunteers appointed to serve as bridges between the parish and parishioners in different areas of Greater Jakarta.

Their main role is to assist expatriate parishioners — especially newcomers — by:

- Providing information about parish life, Mass schedules, ministries, and registration.
- Helping coordinate pastoral and sacramental needs with our parish priests.
- Creating local WhatsApp groups (similar to lingkungan) to keep everyone connected and informed about parish updates and activities.






