**First Reading Rv 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab**

**[Mary, the Ark]**

*The appearance of the Ark in this time of retribution indicates that God is now accessible-no longer hidden, but present in the midst of his people. Filled with hatred, the devil spares no pains to destroy Christ and his Church. The dragon seeks to destroy the celestial woman and her Son. Its hatred is futile.*

A reading from the first Book of Revelation

God's temple in heaven was opened, and the ark of his covenant could be seen in the temple.

A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon beneath her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth. Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems. Its tail swept away a third of the stars in the sky and hurled them down to the earth. Then the dragon stood before the woman about to give birth, to devour her child when she gave birth. She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne. The woman herself fled into the desert where she had a place prepared by God.

“Now have salvation and power come, and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Anointed One.”

**Gospel** Lk 1:39-56 [Blessed among Women]

Mary visits her kinswoman, Elizabeth. Mary’s song of thanksgiving, often called the “Magnificat,” has been put together from many Old Testament phrases.

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary’s greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, “Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled.”

And Mary said:  
 “My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord;

**Preface** [Assumption - Sign of Hope]
