

PART ONE: THE SOLEMN BEGINNING OF THE VIGIL

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

All the lights in the church are put out A large fire is prepared

[Keeping the Lord's Paschal Solemnity]

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters)

on this most sacred night,

in which our Lord Jesus Christ

passed over from death to life,

the Church calls upon her sons and daughters,

scattered throughout the world,

to come together to watch and pray.

If we keep the memorial

of the Lord's paschal solemnity in this way.

listening to his word and celebrating his mysteries,

then we shall have the sure hope

of sharing his triumph over death

and living with him in God.

The Priest blesses the fire, with hands extended:

Let us pray.

[Fire of God's Glory]

O God, who through your Son

bestowed upon the faithful the fire of your glory,

sanctify * this new fire, we pray,

and grant that.

by these paschal celebrations,

we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires.

that with minds made pure

we may attain festivities of unending splendor.

Through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.

The Easter candle is lighted from the new fire.

The procession may follow immediately or the optional blessing of the candle may follow.

Preparation of the Candle

1. Christ vesterday and today (he cuts a Vertical line).

2. the Beginning and the End. (he cuts a horizontal line)

3. the Alpha, (he cuts the Letter Alpha above the vertical line) (he cuts the Letter Omega below the vertical line) 4. and the Omega: 5. All time belongs to him, (he cuts the first numeral of the current year in the

upper left corner of the cross);

(he cuts the second numeral of the current year in 6. and all the ages

the upper right corner of the cross).

(he cuts the third numeral of the current year in 7. To him be glory and power

the lower left corner of the cross);

(he cuts the fourth numeral of the current year in 8. through every age

and for ever. Amen. the lower right corner of the cross).

Lighting of the Candle

When the cross and other marks have been made, the priest may insert five grains of incense in the candle. He does this in the form of a cross, saying:

1. By his holy

3. may Christ our Lord	4	2	5

5. and protect us. Amen.		3	

Lighting of the Candle

The priest lights the Paschal candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ, rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

Procession STAND

At the door of the church the Priest standing and raising up the candle, sings:

V. The Light of Christ.

R. Thanks be to God.

The Priest lights his candle from the flame of the paschal candle.

Then the Priest moves forward to the middle of the church and, standing and raising up the candle, sings a second time;

V. The Light of Christ.

R. Thanks be to God.

All light their candles from the flame of the paschal candle and continue in procession. When the Priest arrives before the altar, he stands facing the people, raises up the candle and sings a third time:

V. The Light of Christ.

R. Thanks be to God.

Then the lights in Church are put on, except for the altar candles.

Easter Proclamation: Exsultet

The Easter Proclamation maybe sung. (please refer to the song sheets) All stand and hold lighted candles.

PART TWO: THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

SIT

After The Easter proclamation, the candles are put aside and all sit down. The priest speaks to the people;

[Listen with Quiet Hearts]

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters), now that we have begun our solemn Vigil, let us listen with quiet hearts to the Word of God.

Let us meditate on how God in times past saved his people and in these, the last days, has sent us his Son as our Redeemer.

Let us pray that our God may complete this paschal work of salvation by the fullness of redemption.

First Reading

Genesis 1:1-2:2

God created the world and all that is in it.

A reading from the book of Genesis. **SHORTER FORM** [God Our Creator]

- ▶ In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, ◀
- ▶ God said: "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground."

God created man in his image; in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

God blessed them, saying: "Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that move on the earth." God also said: "See, I give you every seed-bearing plant all over the earth and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; and to all the animals of the land, all the birds of the air, and all the living creatures that crawl on the ground, I give all the green plants for food." And so it happened. God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good.

[The Lord's Goodness]

R./ The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.

Upright is the word of the LORD,

and all his works are trustworthy.

He loves justice and right;

of the kindness of the LORD the earth is full. (R.)

By the word of the LORD the heavens were made;

by the breath of his mouth all their host.

He gathers the waters of the sea as in a flask;

in cellars he confines the deep. (R.)

Blessed the nation whose God is the LORD,

the people he has chosen for his own inheritance. From heaven the LORD looks down;

he sees all mankind. (R.)

Our soul waits for the LORD, who is our help and our shield. May your kindness, O LORD, be upon us who have put our hope in you. (R.)

Prayer

[Creation in the Beginning]

Let us pray.

Almighty ever-living God,

who are wonderful in the ordering of all your works,

may those you have redeemed understand

that there exists nothing more marvelous

than the world's creation in the beginning

except that, at the end of the ages,

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed.

Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. *R./Amen.*

Second Reading Genesis 22:1-2,9a,10-13,15-18 [SHORTER FORM]/Obedience to God/

The sacrifice of Abraham our father in faith.

A reading from the Book of Genesis.

God put Abraham to the test.

He called to him. "Abraham!"

"Here I am," he replied.

Then God said:

"Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love,

and go to the land of Moriah.

There you shall offer him up as a holocaust

on a height that I will point out to you."

When they came to the place of which God had told him,

Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it.

Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son.

But the Lord's messenger called to him from heaven,

"Abraham, Abraham!"

"Here I am." he answered.

"Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger.

"Do not do the least thing to him."

I know now how devoted you are to God,

since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son."

As Abraham looked about.

he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket.

So he went and took the ram

and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son.

Again the Lord's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said:

"I swear by myself, declares the Lord,

Therefore my heart is glad and my soul rejoices,

my body, too, abides in confidence;

because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld,

nor will you suffer your faithful one to undergo corruption. (R)

You will show me the path to life,

fullness of joys in your presence,

the delights at your right hand forever. (R)

Prayer

[Entering into Grace]

Let us pray.

O God, supreme Father of the faithful.

who increase the children of your promise

by pouring out the grace of adoption

throughout the whole world

and who through the Paschal Mystery

make your servant Abraham father of nations.

as once you swore.

grant, we pray,

that your peoples may enter worthily

into the grace to which you call them.

Through Christ our Lord. R/Amen.

Third Reading

Is 55: 1-11

[God of Forgiveness]

God is a loving Father and he calls his people back. He promises an everlasting covenant with them. God is merciful, generous, and forgiving.

A reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah.

THUS says the LORD:

All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk! Why

spend your money for what is not bread; your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David. As I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of nations, so shall you summon a nation you knew not, and nations that knew you not shall run to you, because of the Lord, your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you.

Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked man his thoughts; let him turn to the Lord for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways, and my thoughts above your thoughts.

For just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall nor return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

The choir takes up the Responsorial Psalm immediately.

Responsorial Psalm

Is 12

[Make Know God's Deeds]

R./ You will draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation.

God indeed is my savior; I am confident and unafraid. My strength and my courage is the Lord, and he has been my savior. With joy you will draw water at the fountain of salvation. (R.)

Give thanks to the Lord, acclaim his name; among the nations make known his deeds, proclaim how exalted is his name. (R.)

Sing praise to the Lord for his glorious achievement; let this be known throughout all the earth. Shout with exultation, O city of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel! (R.)

Prayer

[Progress in Virtue]

Let us pray.
Almighty ever-living God, sole hope of the world, who by the preaching of your Prophets unveiled the mysteries of this present age, graciously increase the longing of your people, for only at the prompting of your grace do the faithful progress in any kind of virtue Through Christ our Lord. *R.* Amen.

STAND

After the last reading from the Old Testament with its responsorial psalm and prayer, the altar candles are lighted, and the priest in tones the *Gloria*, which is taken up by all present. The church bells are rung, according to local custom.

At the end of the Gloria, the priest sings or says the opening prayer in the usual way.

Collect

[Renewed in Body and Mind]

Let us pray.

O God, who make this most sacred night radiant with the glory of the Lord's Resurrection, stir up in your Church a spirit of adoption, so that, renewed in body and mind, we may render you undivided service.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *R/Amen*.

Enistle

Roman 6:3-11 [Alive in Christ]

SIT

Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans.

Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into the death, so that, as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. For a dead person has been absolved from sin. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as being dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

R/Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm.

[God's Mercy]

STAND

R/. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever.

Let the house of Israel say,

"His mercy endures forever." (R.)

The right hand of the Lord has struck with power; the right hand of the Lord is exalted. I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord. (R.)

The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. By the Lord has this been done; it is wonderful in our eyes. (R.)

Incenses may be used at the gospel, candles are not carried.

Gospel<A

Mt 28:1-10

[The Resurrection]

*R/The Lord be with you. R/And with your spirit.*A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. *R/Glory to you Lord.*

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. His appearance was like lightning and his clothing was white as snow. The guards were shaken with fear of him and became like dead men. Then the angel said to the women in reply, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him.' Behold, I have told you." Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce this to his disciples. And behold, Jesus met them on their way and greeted them. They approached, embraced his feet, and did him homage. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

PART THREE: BLESSING OF BAPTISMAL WATER & THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

BLESSING OF BAPTISMAL WATER

[Grace-Filled Water]

The Priest then blesses the baptismal water, saying the following prayer with hands extended:

O God, who by invisible power accomplish a wondrous effect through sacramental signs and who in many ways have prepared water, your creation, to show forth the grace of Baptism;

O God, whose Spirit in the first moments of the world's creation hovered over the waters, so that the very substance of water would even then take to itself the power to sanctify;

O God, who by the outpouring of the flood foreshadowed regeneration, so that from the mystery of one and the same element of water would come an end to vice and a beginning of virtue;

O God, who caused the children of Abraham to pass dry-shod through the Red Sea, so that the chosen people, set free from slavery to Pharaoh, would prefigure the people of the baptized;

O God, whose Son, baptized by John in the waters of the Jordan, was anointed with the Holy Spirit, and, as he hung upon the Cross, gave forth water from his side along with blood, and after his Resurrection, commanded his disciples: "Go forth, teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," look now, we pray, upon the face of your Church and graciously unseal for her the fountain of Baptism.

May this water receive by the Holy Spirit the grace of your Only Begotten Son, So that human nature, created in your image and washed clean through the Sacrament of Baptism from all the squalor of the life of old, may be found worthy to rise to the life of newborn children through water and the Holy Spirit.

And, If appropriate, lowering the paschal candle into the water either once or three times, he continues:

May the power of the Holy Spirit, O Lord, we pray, come down through your Son into the fullness of this font.

and, holding the candle in the water, he continues:

so that all who have been buried with Christ by Baptism into death may rise again to life with him.

Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **R/Amen.**

Then the candle is lifted out of the water, as the people acclaim:

Spring of water, bless the Lord; praise and exalt him above all for ever.

Relight the candles

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

STAND

INVITATION

[Call to Renewal]

All present stand and hold lighted candles to renew their baptismal promises.

The priest speaks to the people in these or similar words:

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters), through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life.

And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask you:

RENUNCIATION OF SIN

[Reject Evil]

Priest: Do you renounce Satan?

All: Ido.

Priest: And all his works?

All: Ido.

Priest: And all his empty show?

All: Ido.

PROFFESION OF FAITH

[We do Believe]

Then the Priest continues:

Priest: Do you believe in God, the Father almighty,

Creator of heaven and earth?

All: Ido.

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead

and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: Ido.

Priest: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and life everlasting?

All : **Ido.**

And the Priest concludes:

And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life.

All : Amen.

SPRINKLINGWITH BAPTISMAL WATER

[Water of life]

The Priest sprinkles all the people with the blessed baptismal water, while all sing the following song or any other that is baptismal in character.

Antiphon.

I saw water flowing from the Temple, from its right-hand side, alleluia; and all to whom this water came were saved and shall say: Alleluia, alleluia.

At end of sprinkling with baptismal water, put out the candles.

Offertory family brings up the offerings

PART FOUR: THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Priest goes to the altar and begins the Liturgy of the Eucharist in the usual way.

Preparation of the Bread

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life. *All: Blessed be God for ever.*

Preparation of the Wine

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Invitation To Prayer

Priest : Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice

and yours may be acceptable to God,

the almighty Father.

People: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands

for the praise and glory of his name,

for our good and the good of all his Holy Church

Prayer over the Offerings

[God's Saving Work]

STAND

STAND

Accept, we ask, O Lord, the prayers of your people with the sacrificial offerings, that what has begun in the paschal mysteries may, by the working of your power, bring us to the healing of eternity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

STAND

Introductory Dialogue
The Lord be with you.
And with your spirit.

Lift up your hearts

We lift them up to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just

Preface I of Easter

[The Paschal Mystery]

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, at all times to acclaim you, O Lord, but (on this night) above all to laud you yet more gloriously, when Christ our Passover has been sacrificed.

For he is the true Lamb who has taken away the sins of the world; by dying he has destroyed our death, and by rising, restored our life.

Therefore, overcome with paschal joy, every land, every people exults in your praise and even the heavenly powers, with the angelic hosts, sing together the unending hymn of your glory, as they acclaim:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts....

Eucharistic Prayer 1

Praise to the Father

To you, therefore, most merciful Father, we make humble prayer and petition through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord:

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

that you accept and bless * these gifts, these offerings, these holy and unblemished sacrifices,

Intercession for the Church

which we offer you firstly for your holy catholic Church. Be pleased to grant her peace, to guard, unite and govern her throughout the whole world, together with your servant *N*. our Pope and *N*. our Bishop, and all those who, holding to the truth, hand on the catholic and apostolic faith.

Commemoration of the Living

Remember, Lord, your servants *N*. and *N*. and all gathered here, whose faith and devotion are known to you.

For them, we offer you this sacrifice of praise or they offer it for themselves and all who are dear to them: for the redemption of their souls, in hope of health and well-being, and paying their homage to you, the eternal God, living and true.

In Communion with the Saints & with these whose memory we venerate

From the Mass of the Easter Vigil until the Second Sunday of Easter

Celebrating the most sacred night (day) of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh, and in communion with those whose memory we venerate, especially the glorious ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of our God and Lord, Jesus Christ, and blessed Joseph, her Spouse your blessed Apostles and Martyrs, Peter and Paul, Andrew, (James, John, Thomas, James, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Simon and Jude; Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian) and all your Saints; we ask that through their merits and prayers, in all things we may be defended by your protecting help. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

From the Mass of the Easter Vigil until the Second Sunday of Easter

Therefore, Lord, we pray: graciously accept this oblation of our service, that of your whole family, which we make to you also for those to whom you have been pleased to give the new birth of water and the Holy Spirit, granting them forgiveness of all their sins; order our days in your peace, and command that we be delivered from eternal damnation and counted among the flock of those you have chosen. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

Be pleased, O God, we pray, to bless, acknowledge, and approve this offering in every respect; make it spiritual and acceptable, so that it may become for us the Body and Blood of your most beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Lord's Supper

On the day before he was to suffer, he took bread in his holy and venerable hands, and with eyes raised to heaven to you, O God, his almighty Father, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took this precious chalice in his holy and venerable hands, and once more giving you thanks, he said the blessing and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in memory of me.

Memorial Acclamation

Priest: The mystery of faith.

All: When we eat this Bread
and drink this cup,

we proclaim your Death, O Lord,

until you come again.

The Memorial Prayer

Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the blessed Passion, the Resurrection from the dead, and the glorious Ascension into heaven of Christ, your Son, our Lord, we, your servants and your holy people, offer to your glorious majesty from the gifts that you have given us, this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation.

Be pleased to look upon these offerings with a serene and kindly countenance, and to accept them, as once you were pleased to accept the gifts of your servant Abel the just, the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith, and the offering of your high priest Melchizedek, a holy sacrifice, a spotless victim.

In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these giftbe borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty, so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

For the Dead

Remember also, Lord, your servants *N*. and *N*., who have gone before us with the sign of faith and rest in the sleep of peace.
Grant them, O Lord, we pray, and all who sleep in Christ, a place of refreshment, light and peace. (Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**)

For the Living

To us, also, your servants, who, though sinners, hope in your abundant mercies, graciously grant some share and fellowship with your holy Apostles and Martyrs: with John the Baptist, Stephen, Matthias, Barnabas, (Ignatius, Alexander, Marcellinus, Peter, Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anastasia) and all your Saints; admit us, we beseech you, into their company, not weighing our merits, but granting us your pardon, through Christ our Lord.

Through whom you continue to make all these good things, O Lord; you sanctify them, fill them with life, bless them, and bestow them upon us.

Concluding Doxology

Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Communion Rite
